Sustainable Biomass Program

Promise of good biomass

- Non-profit, independent, multi-peoples, voluntary certification scheme
- Sourcing standard = feedstock is sourced from legal and sustainable sources
- Specifically developed for woody biomass pellets & wood chips
- Global one stop shop Covering all existing regulation recognised: EC - REDII, UK, NL, Japan
- Independent auditing and certification: ISO 17011 / 17065
- Member of the ISEAL Alliance seeks to strengthen sustainability standards via Codes of Best Practise
- Ca 360 Companies / 36 countries / ca. 16mt in 2023 / 80% EU consumption / 30% global pellet production

















Data Transfer System - DTS

The Data Transfer System is a cloud-based digital tool for the transfer of SBP claims, production and sustainability data along the supply chain!

- Facebook/LinkedIn connect producers and buyers
- 360 Certificate Holders = 3,000+ Business Relationships = Access to data
- Mandatory use / No trade of SBP certified material allowed outside of the DTS
- · Every transaction is tracked
- Eliminates fraud in the supply chain
- Users utilise data for GHG calculations

EU Deforestation Regulation

Traceability solution for SBP-certified biomass in the market



- The EU Deforestation Regulation (EUDR), adopted in 2023, is designed to prevent products linked to deforestation from entering the European Union market.
- EUDR targets palm oil, soy, coffee, cocoa, beef, rubber and wood, along with their derived products.
- Under the EUDR, companies (based in the EU) must prove that their supply chains are deforestationfree.
- The EUDR emphasises due diligence, requiring companies in the EU to trace the origin of products and provide evidence of their sustainability.
- => Approximately 50,000 companies in the EU are directly impacted by the EUDR.

- EUDR is not intended to be complied with via a Voluntary Certification Scheme.
- EU based companies must establish and maintain a due diligence system to prove deforestation-free supply chains themselves.
- Certification Schemes including SBP will not provide the Green lane for EUDR.
- Overlap SBP Certification \Leftrightarrow Company EUDR Due Diligence
