



## Benefits of using wood pellets

> Not in "competition" with food sources

Product is fairly homogeneous (integral component for refineries)

> Supply chains already existing



## Challenges to forest residue take-off

- > Collection and pre-processing need to be improved.
- > Technology needs to be advanced (pyrolysis, HTL, FT) and biorefinery capital-intensive
- > The main challenge is that forest residues have other potential markets.
  -Pellets are shipped overseas for fuel. There must be incentives in place to draw these feedstocks into SAF markets.
- > Renewable diesel production is more attractive than SAF for many reasons.
